

## **Poster Guidelines**

Posters should be a maximum of 1m x 1.1m (L x H). Either Velcro tape or pins (provided on-site) will be used to attach the posters to the poster boards. The location of each poster will be assigned at registration.

All graduate student poster contributions will be eligible for the Green Crop Network poster award.

For the purposes of the above acknowledgement, “GCN support” can be defined as:

1. Direct funding (e.g., graduate student salary, PDF/RA salary, materials and supplies, etc.);
2. Work that was undertaken as a direct result of the GCN technical agenda, even if funded from complementary sources;
3. Work for which the GCN was a direct scientific influence.

## **Student Oral Presentation Guidelines**

The time allocated for each presentation is 10 minute plus 3 minuet question period. The time and date of each presentation will be communicated to participants upon selection of their abstracts.

All graduate student presentations will be eligible for the Green Crop Network presentation award. Abstracts for student presentations will be evaluated by the Green Crop Network Competition Committee. The selected abstracts will be invited to present at the Green Crop Network AGM and will be eligible for the GCN student oral presentation award.
